# TERRITORY COMPETITIVENESS: CASE STUDY PERM REGION

Abstract. The paper discusses the competitive aspects of the Perm region development. The author analyzes the various definitions of the "territory competitiveness" concept and various approaches to the definition of the main indicators reflecting competitiveness factors. The Perm Territory competitiveness analysis in terms of production, innovation, infrastructure and institutional criteria according to the Michael Porter's theory was carried out. The analysis was conducted on the basis of statistical data, the results of monitoring and surveys in Perm region. The production criterion is analyzed by the author based on the dynamic's indicator of the number of registered economic entities in the region, their structure, including small business and the individual entrepreneurs' composition.
