

TRANSFORMATION OF EMPLOYMENT IN AGRICULTURE IN THE TERRITORY OF SVERDLOVSK REGION - NON-STANDARD DECISIONS¹

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Abstract. In article the review of dynamics of indicators of employment in agrarian sector of economy of Sverdlovsk region for 2001-2014 is given. Need of change of methods of forecasting of quantitative and qualitative need for shots for the agrarian sphere of the region locates. Results of approbation of the separate methodical approaches in forecasting considering processes of introduction of technical and technological innovations, and also calculations of possible economic losses in connection with transformation of employment of the agrarian sphere are presented. Relevance of development of programs for development and use of labor capacity of the agricultural territories of the region providing application of non-standard forms of employment is proved.
