

ASSESSMENT AND REDUCTION OF OCCUPATIONAL ACCIDENTS AND OCCUPATIONAL MORBIDITY IN THE SBERBANK PJSC

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Abstract. The article is devoted to the development of measures that reduce industrial injuries and occupational diseases in PJSC «Sberbank of Russia». Based on the analysis the ways of reducing the employees' morbidity were offered at the organizational, motivational and social levels; the authors calculated the economic effectiveness of the proposed activities for the regional network in the Sverdlovsk region. Implementation of the proposed model would improve the state of personnel health in the Sverdlovsk department as a resource of enhance the public services quality. The actions proposed by the authors could not only reduce injuries and morbidity, but also earn extra income at the same time.
